The Leadership Training Classes for adults opened on January 11, 1932, and were continued for five and a half years. They were conducted by *teachers especially trained or experienced in the subject taught* and dealt with such problems in religious education as child psychology, methods of the education of children, environmental problems, the personality of the child, religious instruction, ethics, religion and society, and religion and the individual.

Practical instruction was likewise offered for teachers along such lines as dramatization in religion, teaching obligations of the church
