

Board Meeting, June 17, 1931. Financial year to ~~extend~~ Aug. 12, 1930 to Aug. 12, 1931.

Director of Museum reported number of visitors to date at Museum as 6,087; attendance at classes and lectures, 1,842; 21 lectures given; 91 objects made in craft shop; 5 publications issued.

Board voted to apply for membership - or registration of the Museum - in The American Museum Association. Question of keeping museum open during the summer. Cincinnati Astronomical Society asked for assistance in financing erection of its new building. The matter was tabled. Questions of water heater, hinges, repair of Dresden candelabra, Steinway piano, typewriters, cistern, chimneys, gutter and roof, and care of Hard Maple tree. Also concrete suggestions for activities of Foundation for coming fall and winter: (1) organization of a girls' club, (2) a possible Junior League, (3) and assisting the Community Council of Religious Education, perhaps by paying the salary of one of the teachers, by engaging her as a recreational director for the Foundation, or engaging her in some other way (ways suggested). Agreed on quarterly Board Meetings.

Board Meeting, Oct. 14, 1931. At a meeting on July 2, 1931 of the Directors and a number of "key" people in the community, decided to form an Advisory Council to work with the Directors and staff of the Foundation in developing the most practical lines of work. Letters were sent to 16 persons asking them to serve on such a council. 11 accepted. On July 9th, after consultation with the Community Council of Religious Education for Covington, the Board offered to erect a class room for the use of the public school pupils who could be brought to the Baker-Hunt Foundation for (religious) class work, ... to invite the Council to hold its meetings here, and to pay the salary of the Principal, Miss Attig.
