John W Baker died Tuesday January 30, 1894, at 2 p.m. at his home, 620 Greenup street, Covington Ky. in the 83d year of his age (viz., 82)

Obituary: J W BAKER DEAD He was one of Covington's Oldest and Best-Known Citizens. Mr J W Baker died at his home, 620 Greenup street. ... yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock, after a short illness. The immediate cause of his death was from heart trouble. Mr Baker was at one time a very prominent business man, and was widely known in the commercial world. At the time of his death he was 83 years of age (?). He was born in Philadelphia Oct. 11, 1811. He moved West in 1839 and went into business with the late Henry Von Phul. On the 3d of October of the same year he was married to Mrs Hamilton Adams Potier (recte, Mrs ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Henrietta Adams Potter). In June, 1854 he took up his residence at No 620 Greenup street, where he died. His only son, William J Baker, died on the 16th of July, 1886 (recte 1866). His daughter, Mrs W H Hunt, survives him. He was one of the active members of Trinity Church, and a generous, kind-hearted and benevolent citizen.

Rev H Grattan Noland officiated, assisted by the former rectors, Rev Frank Woods Baker and Dr Mueller Baker. The pall-bearers were Messrs Robert Crumpton (Crompton ?), William Perkins, Edward Grant, Frank Woodall, George Gray, George Ward, William Benton, and George Abbott.
