

Museum Summary - 1:

Summary of Museum Report July 1 - Sept 30, 1932. Archie J. Williams, Director. During the summer about 2500 news specimens were added by members of the staff as follows (largest is 1100 insects; next, 450 plants). Permanent Loan Collection of 413 birds from the Cincinnati Society of Natural History has been received. 5 records of the seventeen-year cicada reported to the State of Kentucky. Assisted State of Ky., U of Cincinnati and local students in insect study. Special visitors, H T Vanderfond, U S Bureau of Entomology, and John Moyer, Field Museum. Proposes an exhibit. printing a bird record, and preparing a check list.

Jan-Mar., 1933. Williams reports: Field Expeditions, 6; accession of specimens, 367; cleaning and mounting specimens, cataloging exhibits, and Museum Room arranged for spring and summer displays,

Oct-Dec., 1933. The Museum. Full schedule of activities was resumed here Oct. 1, 1933. Craft Shop enrollment the largest that can be accommodated. Museum attendance larger than for any corresponding previous period. Several special exhibits, notably wild turkey, which brought over 200 persons Thanksgiving week-end. With recent addition of Mr Cleveland Grant to the staff of the Foundation as director of extension servicem the schools are beginning to make docented visits to the museum as a supplement to classroom work. What has been done in the short time Mr Grant has been with us seems to justify the experiment.

July 1 - Oct, 1933. Course of lectures on bird life given by Cleveland P Grant was welcomed by the principal of each school, one said in writing, it was the finest educational feature of the kind they had ever had
