One of the finest pieces of work done by the Foundation was the outgrowth of the peculiar circumstances in which the Foundation was launched, and with them, of the special opportunities to which they gave rise.

At the Board meeting in June 17, 1931 there was some discussion of possible activities for the coming fall and winter, the concrete suggestions being the organization of a girl's club, a possible Junior League.... They thought of engaging a teacher for the CCRE work, who would also be the leader of the girl's club.

Oct 14, 1932, a plan for organizing a girls' club along departmental lines and under competent direction was presented by the Executive Secretary, and made order for a special meeting to be called early in November.

Present it thus: the idea had already been suggested in the spring of 1931, and by the fall of 1932 the opportunity presented itself which gave a chance to carry into execution....

Meeting of November 9th. The meeting was called for the purpose of discussing the possible organization of a girls' club under the leadership of Mrs Elizabeth S Collins. They approved it and decided to start with Mrs Collins Nov 15th on a half-time basis.
