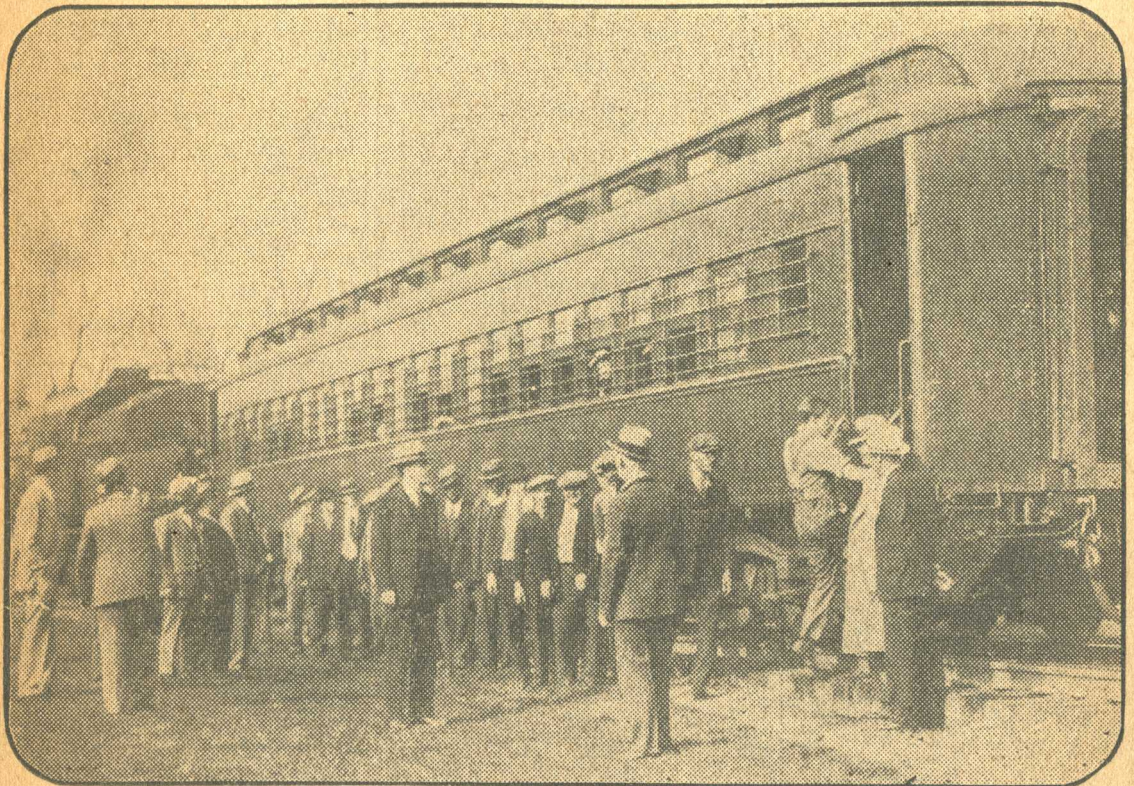


SPECIAL TRAIN LEAVES FOR SOUTH
