

Introduction:

The papers, photographs, music recordings, and miscellaneous material of a Kenton County Agriculture Agent from 1919-1959.

Biography:

Carl Anton Wicklund was born on November 1, 1889, in Sweden to Andrew and Annie Wicklund. The family immigrated to the United States in 1891 and settled in Central City, Muhlenberg County, Kentucky. Wicklund graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1917 with a B.S. in Agriculture. He was then commissioned as an officer in the U.S Army and assigned to Camp Zachary Taylor, Louisville, Kentucky, and later a raining school at the University of Cincinnati. In March 1919, he became the Agriculture Agent for Kenton County, Kentucky, serving in the position until December 1959. He was married to Julia Folmer Wicklund () and they had four children: Anna, Doris, Andra, and Carl. Wicklund died on May 7, 1966.
