Students searching for scholarships to college must complete the FAFSA form through the Federal government prior to applying for any type of financial aid. (<http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/>) Before starting the FAFSA, students must have financial data for themselves (adults) or parents (if a minor) and college codes for the institutions they hope to attend. (Students can also access university codes via the FAFSA application process.) The FAFSA determines each student's EFC or "Estimated Family Contribution" towards tuition for a given year. The FAFSA must be submitted annually.

Prospective students can search any of the above sites for external scholarships, but all accredited colleges will provide internal scholarship information themselves and encourage students to explore opportunities with parent's employers, local civic groups, foundations and businesses.
